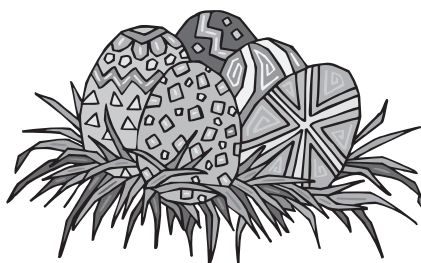

## Monthly Meeting Minutes

### Call to Order, Approval of Agenda, Introductions

The meeting was promptly called to order at 7:30 p.m. The agenda was approved as presented, with the addition of two items: Code Inspection/Enforcement and George Washington Middle School Track and Field Initiatives.

### Code Inspection and Enforcement

Wendell Phillips from the City of Alexandria Property Code Maintenance Section attended the meeting to describe the broad responsibilities of his office. There have been many recent complaints of trash at the curb when it isn't trash day (particularly in the alley-ways and behind Glebe/Mount Vernon businesses), trash that is not in proper receptacles, and vegetation blocking roadways. The City is happy to enforce the maintenance associated with such issues, in addition to rodent problems, noise, abandoned homes, and more. ### Sheriff Report

Mondré Kornegay from the Alexandria Sheriff's Department shared that the Department has recently been Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies, Inc., (CALEA)-certified. CALEA improves the delivery of public safety services by maintaining a body of standards, developed by public safety practitioners, that cover a wide range of up-to-date public safety initiatives; establishing and administering an accreditation process; and recognizing professional excellence.

Additionally, Ms. Kornegay spoke about the City's Project Lifesaver Program, which provides tracking bracelets for little to no cost to those with dementia other conditions that may cause participants to become confused. Recently, the Program actually helped a Del Ray/WVCA resident's family locate a participant who was reported missing.

Finally, Ms. Kornegay suggested that the Sheriff's Department might be able to provide services to help clean up our neighborhoods—WVCA is welcome to reach out for assistance.

### Police Report

This month's crime report includes a few instances of property destruction in the Village, particularly auto break-ins and theft. The officers reemphasized the importance of locking your car doors—offenders are walking the streets looking for unlocked cars they can easily reach into to steal items. So far this calendar year in the City of Alexandria, there have been 111 instances of auto larceny, 49 of which occurred in Del Ray/Arlandria area.

Additionally, an ID theft was reported in the Aspen building—if you can, be sure to shred anything with personally identifiable information.

The officers addressed the homicide that took place on nearby Holly Street. The Alexandria Homicide Division has taken the lead on the case. That being said, a suspect was arrested the next day on burglary charges; however, she has not been charged with the homicide at this point. At this point, the investigators do not believe that the homicide was a random act—this was an isolated incident and the Police Department does not believe at this time there is a specific danger to the community. Additionally, the detectives believe that what has really helped in this case is the fact that the victim took advantage of the Alexandria Crime Prevention Survey. If you are interested in participating in such surveys, contact Charles Lloyd with the Alexandria Police Department.

In general, don't hesitate to call the police if you notice suspicious activity, whether it is a suspicious individual, or suspicious item(s) you may notice. If you can narrow a time frame on suspicious found items, it would be helpful to the officer(s) that responds.

### Treasurer's Report

There was no official report as the WVCA treasurer could not make the meeting. However, the president reported that there is currently \$14,003 in the WVCA bank account.

### Street Meet Introduction

The president introduced the new WVCA activity planned for this year called "Street Meets." The idea is that these mini-block parties provide a chance to get to know your WVCA neighbors on the street where you live. Look for fliers to

come to specific street residents as the events are planned.

### Adopt-a-Park

WVCA expects the forms to arrive from the city soon. During the WVCA membership meeting, a sign-up sheet was passed around to volunteer for a 1-month period to clean up one of our 3 WVCA parks every Sunday. The following week, the City will come around to grade us on the cleanliness of our parks. ### Membership

The membership chair introduced our new WVCA commemorative Frisbees. So far this calendar year, membership is up. At the meeting, it was announced that we currently have 29 paid memberships. Not only does your membership support our great organization, but it also helps emphasize our strengths in numbers to the city in the case of tough budget decisions, city services, and more.

### Communications

Currently, there are over 150 followers and friends on Twitter and Facebook, respectively. Additionally, we'll be revamping our website, and utilizing emails to circulate announcements to WVCA members. ### Parks Report

### March Meeting and Presentation

The next WVCA meeting is scheduled for March 18, featuring special guest George L. Byrne, the Staff Appraiser for the Department of Real Estate Assessments in the City of Alexandria. Particularly, we look forward to speaking with

this former Warwick Village resident about the increase in property assessments in the area.

### Special Presentation

#### Gwen Wright, Division Chief, Development Division, City of Alexandria Department of Planning and Zoning

Ms. Wright provided a detailed presentation on the history and current status of the Potomac yard Development. The Development has been in the works for over 15 years, and is divided into two sections: North Potomac Yard (where the current shopping center is now, with Target, Best Buy, the movie theater, etc.) and South Potomac Yard (where the new homes, condos

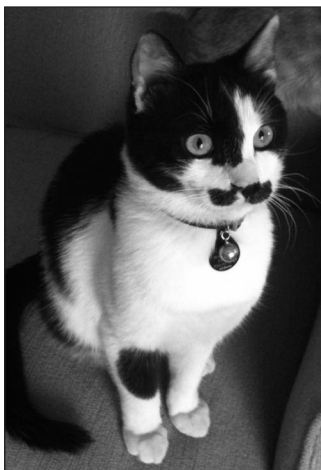
and apartments have sprouted). She explained the planned rapid transit line that will run the length of Route 1 from Braddock Metro to Crystal City, and also shared plans for a linear park along the new Potomac Avenue for the same length. North Potomac Yard development will potentially take 50 years to develop due to the lengthy leases currently in place. Additionally, its development is contingent on the new Metro station approval, which will pay for the majority of the new development.

The meeting adjourned at 8:45 p.m.

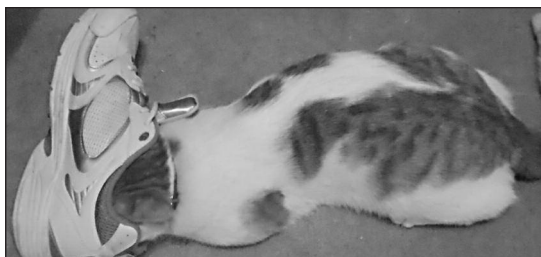

Spud, Husky, and Perot were street kitties born in Amman, Jordan, in the summer of 2011. Now they live on Sycamore Street with their very own human servant. A real "Rags to Riches" tale!

Spud, Husky, and Perot are very naughty cats. How naughty, you ask? They can turn on DVD players and stereos, and even open up the tray compartments! They've opened doors by jumping on the lever-style door handles, and managed to turn on a wall-mounted fan that was seven feet high. (Their servant is still trying to figure that last one out.) They really, really like treats, and their favorite activities are getting into trouble and sleeping.

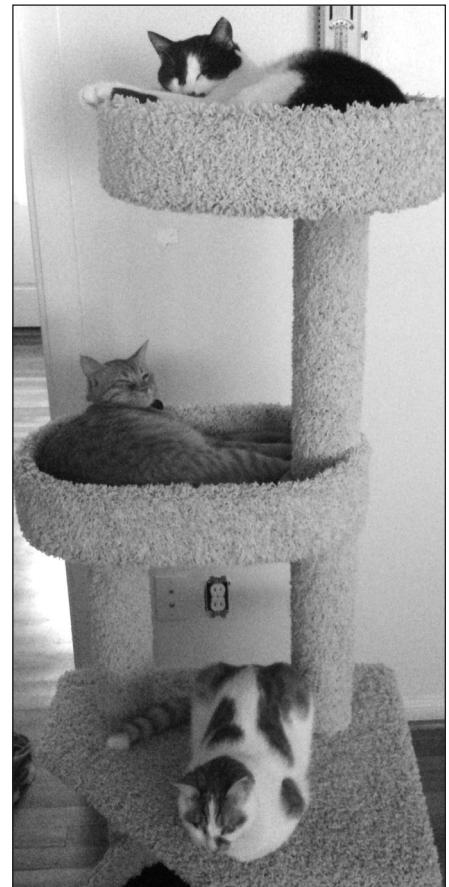
Spud was attacked by a dog when she was just seven weeks old, and that's how she came to live with her servant in Amman. She is half blind, but that doesn't stop her from seeing strings to pull, or finding something she shouldn't in order to play soccer around the house. She takes great pleasure in tipping something down the stairs and then chasing it as it rattles down.

Husky was put in the front yard of the servant's home when he was about nine weeks old by one of the Arab neighbors who thought the servant would take care of him. They were right. Husky is totally blind and was that way from the beginning. He jumps, chases, and wrestles like any other cat. He's the brave one in the family, always investigating visitors first while the other two cower. He also loves shoes and tries to put his entire body into them.

Perot lived in a garbage bin and ate whatever he could find in the trash. When he was about 6 weeks old he was hit by a car and injured his leg. He came to live with his servant when she had the vet come to look him over. Perot was supposed to be named after Agatha Christie's Poirot because of his mustache and inquisitive stare, but his servant misspelled his name. While Perot is the youngest, he is also the biggest of the three and really enjoys basking in the warmth of the radiator as he watches the birds on the telephone lines. He's not too sure what to do with the crows, though. He must be part chicken as he hides for hours when someone new comes into his house or he hears loud noises.

These three traveled to America on a long 21-hour airplane ride which they didn't like very
